KNIGHT of the MONTH

This month's Knight of the Month is our trusty recorder, Brother Knight Bob Gugliotti.



Bob Gugliotti became a brotherhood member of St. Joseph Parish Knights of Columbus Council #13977 on January 14, 2014 when he was bestowed with his First Degree at the local parish where he's been an original member since St. Joseph opened on October 8, 1966 at age six and one-half. He went on to the Second Degree at the Byzantine Center at the Grove on February 8, 2014 and the Third Degree and his Fourth Degree exemplification both at St. Charles of Borromeo Parish in Boardman on April 28 and October 4, 2014, respectively. Bob was accorded that ultimate honor in the class along with current council brothers George Zokle and Victor Considine.

Gugliotti has served in countless ministries and roles at St. Joseph over 51 years. He has served as a Scripture Lector since March 7, 1982 and as a Eucharistic Minister since his recruitment by former permanent Deacon Mike Roberts on October 13, 1998. Bob joined the church choir on September 28, 2014 and is starting his fourth season with the co-ed singing group on October 15th.

Pastoral Parish Council discernment came for Bob on November 4, 2001, and service on his first term until February 11, 2007. Gugliotti was discerned for another term on February 4, 2011 and is in continuing service to that ministry having been discerned yet again on October 6, 2016. Bob is also involved with the current Parish Planning Team working to determine the future course of St. Joseph Parish and its role in shaping the Austintown community in the years to come.

Gugliotti is also connected to the Parish Life Committee's many church-fellowship inspiring activities and the Guardian Angels bereavement mercy meal preparation and presentation group after funeral masses in the church. He is the second-year recorder in this council and former two-year vice-president and secretary of the now-defunct Men's Club organization. Bob also participates in the ceremony and carrying of the candles each Lent for Stations of the Cross services each Friday before Easter.

Born on March 7, 1960 at St. Elizabeth Mercy Health Center near downtown Youngstown on an early morning when the low temperature dipped to an unseasonable minus-three degrees, Gugliotti dwelled in Struthers for three

years before moving to Austintown with his parents and brother Joe Jr. on July 17, 1963. The Gugliotti's were members of St. Christine's for three years until Diocese of Youngstown boundaries required a transition to the newlyminted St. Joseph on October 8, 1966 as an original family here when services were conducted at the relatively-new Wellman's Wedgewood Cinema that had opened on July 27 that year itself.

Bob graduated with an honor diploma and a senior-year induction into National Honor Society in 1978 from Austintown-Fitch High School. He was involved for all four years as an equipment manager and statistician for the Falcons' football, basketball and baseball programs. Other HS clubs included Speech and Debate and the Spanish Club. Graduated with a 3.329 grade-point average, Bob was nominated to Fitch High school's Athletic Hall of Fame most recently on September 17, 2016 with the standout 1979-80 boys' basketball team that finished a school-record 22-3 and regional semifinalists losing by two points to the undefeated State champions from Akron Central-Hower that Bob served as a sophomore student at Youngstown State University, and the 1977 baseball squad that was Fitch's first-ever State tournament qualifier that went 27-2 (best ever record), bowing to Solon in the semifinals in Columbus in "Googs" junior year. He was also recognized with AFHS' 1990 and 1992 playoff football teams serving as the head of the statisticians' crew in 2011 and 2013. Bob was the football teams' statistician from 1975 through 2007, the public address announcer at Fitch boys' and girls' varsity basketball games along with baseball, wrestling matches and girls' gymnastics' meets from 1984-85 through 1997-98 seasons and post-season hoops tournaments held at Fitch HS from 1996 to 2005.

He was also in the Austintown Local School District's mentorship program from 1994 to 2004 in broadcasting operations, the sports industry and special education, guiding gifted and special needs' students. Bob was the sandlot baseball league public address announcer, official scorer, statistician and scoreboard operator at The Joe Koch Family Charitable Foundation's Koch Baseball Complex from May 24, 2005 to July 20, 2008.

Bob graduated twice from YSU with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Telecommunications on August 27, 1983 and a Bachelor of Science sheepskin in Communications Studies, Information Technology and Technical Writing/Publication Design on May 17, 2003. He's proud to have graduated with a 3.577 GPA at age 43. Gugliotti also undertook a Master's of Science Degree program for two years at Kent State University where he carried a 4.0 GPA in Athletic Administration and Sports Management. Lack of grad school tuition funds ended his bid to earn addition academic accolades. Bob's first full-time job out of college was Sports Editor and public meetings correspondent/reporter for The Austintown Leader from November 1984 to April 1993 when it shut down. Also was head sportswriter for the Town Crier newspapers group in 2001 and 2002, another version of The Austintown Leader in 1993 and the short-lived Austin Times tabloid in 1994. Bob was also the Assistant Media Relations Director and head of the stat crew of the summer shorter-player World Basketball League's Youngstown Pride from 1989-1991 and was promoted to the league office in the same capacity in 1992 until the WBL folded on August 1. He received championship rings for the Pride's WBL championships in back-to-back seasons in 1989 and 1990. Gugliotti served as Media Relations Director for the International Basketball League's Mahoning Valley Wildcats' only spring season (19 games) in 2005 playing its home games at Struthers Memorial Fieldhouse.

Gugliotti appreciates all the concern and attention of his parish friends and allies. On September 16, 2015, Bob was diagnosed with high-functioning autism spectrum disorder. The Mensa Society recognized Bob for his tested-IQ that ranges from 139 and up. He found out he was type-2 diabetic on April 2, 2013 and is

managing that illness well. When not involved in some St. Joseph function, you'll find him walking as is his practice for health reasons in the church parking lot, different places around Austintown, or the public library which has become a daily ritual for him. He also mentors young adults in the local neighborhoods as a custom now.






