is our Deputy Grand Knight, Brother Knight Ernie Ramhoff III.



Ernie was born on June 21, 1967 in Youngstown, Ohio. Growing up, Ernie and his family attended St. Luke Church in Boardman until they moved to Austintown when he was in 5th grade. After moving to Austintown, his family became members of St. Michael Church in Canfield. In 1993, he married Mary (Williams) Ramhoff at St. Joseph Church and eventually moved to Cleveland, Ohio where they remained members of the Parish as well as becoming members of SS. Phillip and James Church in Cleveland where Mary taught. In 1999, they moved back to Austintown, and have been members of St. Joe's ever since.

Ernie and Mary have 5 children; Ernie IV, who works for Kraftmaid Cabinets, Trevor, who is attending YSU majoring in Electrical Engineering and currently works as a cook at Mojo's in Austintown, Kyle, who is a

sophomore at Fitch High School and is currently working towards his Eagle Scout with St. Joseph Boy Scout Troop 184 and also working towards getting his driver's license, Bryce, who had been sick with RSV and after a hospital stay and few emergency room visits, unfortunately passed away on March 19, 2003 from strep, and Devin, who is in 7th grade at AMS and is involved in the STEM program, is on the Robotics Team and the Drama Club (He recently landed a role in the upcoming play, Robin Hood as Friar Tuck), and like his brother Kyle is involved with the Boy Scouts.

Ernie works as the Director of Outsourced Services for a computer consulting company, Promethean Software Service in Stow, Ohio. He has been with the company since he and 2 owners founded it in 1999, and has since grown to 7 people which includes 1 network communication engineer, 1EDI services coordinator, 3 Sr. EDI project managers and 2 junior programmer EDI analysts.

Ernie became a member of our council joining as the 30th charter member back in 2006. He jokes that since the requirement is to have 30 members to start a council, there would not be a St. Joseph council without him. He is a Fourth Degree Knight and currently serves as the Deputy Grand Knight. In the past, he has held the positions of Advocate, Recorder, and Treasurer. He became a Knight because he was invited to a meeting by his friend,

Brother Knight Doug Cirbus. He forever thanks Brother Doug for inviting him to the meeting which led him to joining the Knights, and eventually becoming a Fourth Degree Knight alongside him.

In addition to being involved in the K of C, Ernie is also involved with the St. Joseph Boy Scout Troop (Troop 184). In the past, he was a Den Leader and Treasurer for the Cub Scouts, he was appointed a member of the Parish Council by Fr. Trimbur and remained on for 7 years, and was an assistant for 8th grade CCD and filled in as a teacher for 2 years of 8th grade Confirmation students.

As for hobbies, Ernie has never been a very big sports fan; however, he always has rooted for the Cleveland sports teams (Indians, Browns, and Cavaliers) because his dad (Brother Knight Ernie Ramhoff II) was always a Cleveland fan. His favorite food is any dinners at home with the family, and the hobby he enjoys most is working on cars. He has a 1972 Oldsmobile 422 convertible that he bought when he was 17 years old. He later decided to rebuild the motor and restore the body, however, it was never completed and now the car has sat untouched for almost 25 years. He was also very involved with the St. Vincent DePaul Society at our Parish and also served on the board of directors of the St. Vincent DePaul Society Mahoning County.
