This month's Knight of the Month is Brother Knight Bob Pesa.



Bob was born on March 3, 1942 in Youngstown, Ohio and grew up on the city's north side. He attended St. Edward Elementary School, graduated from Ursuline High School in 1960, and then when on to attend YSU to receive his degree in electrical engineering in 1965. After he married his wife, they moved to Austintown.

A founding member of St. Joseph Parish, Bob surprisingly remembers the very first Mass that was celebrated by Father Lyons (founding pastor of St. Joe's) in the old Wedgewood Theater back in 1966. He at first thought that the surroundings were weird because of the fact that everyone was celebrating Mass in a movie theater, but once Mass started, he states "Father Lyons' booming loud voice made him forget the theater surroundings and concentrate on the Mass". Bob also credits Father Lyons for introducing him to music ministry during renewals that he was part. Although he never studied music in school and admits that he is hard of hearing, he has recently rejoined our church choir but "currently has no idea what he is doing." LOL!

Bob raised his two children while living here in Austintown and the whole family has been members of St. Joseph's. However, in 1990, his job at Ajax Magnethermic as an electrical engineer (in which he designed high frequency power supplies for induction heating and melting equipment) was transferred to Richmond, Kentucky. The plant that he worked at was locked out by the Steel Workers Union. While living in Richmond, Bob joined the K of C as a way to meet people in his new parish far from home.

Fortunately in 2002, he was then transferred back to Warren, Ohio and bought a house close to St. Joe's. However, to his disappointment, there was no K of C

council at St. Joseph and he felt that he was a stranger in town. Eventually once our council was started up in 2006, Bob became a charter member of Council 13977 and its first financial secretary.
