Father Fedor received a call asking if we would help with the reception after the annual wedding



Family:


Thanks be to God.

bless our families,


and to the nations so sorely afflicted, grant Thy peace,

POPE FRANCIS MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTION-APRIL 2019



Doctors and their Collaborators in War Zones- For doctors and their humanitarian collaborators in war zones, who risk their lives to save the lives of others.

From "Rejoice and Be Glad" by Pope Francis:

16. The holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures. Here is an example: a woman goes shopping, she meets a neighbor and they begin to speak, and the gossip starts. But she says in her heart: "No I will not speak badly of anyone." This is a step forward in holiness. Later, at home, one of her children wants to talk to her about his hopes and dreams, and even though she is tired, she sits down and listens with patience and love. That is another sacrifice that brings holiness. Later she experiences some anxiety, but recalling the love of the Virgin Mary, she

takes her rosary and prays with faith. Yet another path of holiness. Later still, she goes out onto the street, encounters a poor person and stops to say a kind word to him. One more step.

MONTHLY CATECHISM PASSAGE-APRIL 2019

638 "We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus." The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community; handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross:

Christ is risen from the dead! Dying, he conquered death; To the dead, he has given life.

MONTHLY SCRIPTURE PASSAGE-APRIL 2019

Luke 24:36-49

The Appearance to the Disciples in Jerusalem.

36. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

37. But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost.

38. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts?

39. Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

40. And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet.

- 41. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?"
 42. They gave him a piece of baked fish;
- 43. He took it and ate it in front of them.
- 44. He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled."
- 45. Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures.
- 46. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Messiah would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day
- 47. And that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem.
- 48. You are witnesses of these things.
- 49. And [behold] I am sending the promise of my Father upon you;

but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high.




