REMBERING BROTHER KNIGHTS JOE IWASKEY AND JOE REDA




On Sunday, October 27th, our council sadly lost a very loyal and dedicated Brother Knight in Joe Iwasky, who passed away from an apparent heart attack while on duty with the Army Reserves in Farrell, Pennsylvania.

Joe was born on January 6, 1970 in Austintown, Ohio and lived in the area his entire life. He was a 1988 graduate of Austintown Fitch High School and attended Youngstown State University. Joe had served in the Army Reserves for the past 20 years and currently worked for Delphi-Packard Electric in Warren, Ohio.

Joe was a longtime member at St. Joseph Parish and was a Fourth Degree Knight in our council currently serving as a trustee. He also was an avid runner who last ran the Panerathon 10k race in Youngstown this past summer and also enjoyed spending time with his family and friends.

Joe is survived by his mother, Kathy Iwaskey, with whom he made his home; eight siblings, Edward M. Iwaskey of Youngstown, Steve P. Iwaskey of Columbus, Mary H. Iwaskey of Columbus, Bill A. Iwaskey of Butler, Pennsylvania, Robert C. Iwaskey of Austintown, Thomas J. Iwaskey of Austintown, Patty and Dennis Walker of Columbus, Paul D. Iwaskey of Austintown, one niece, Mariah Snowden, and one nephew, Jonathan Walker.

On Tuesday, November 5th our council lost a longtime dedicated Brother Knight and parishioner of St. Joseph, Joe Reda, who passed away after suffering from a courageous, half decade long struggle with Alzheimer's Disease.

Joe was born on December 5, 1940 in Youngstown, Ohio and was a lifelong resident of the Mahoning Valley. He was a 1958 graduate of Woodrow Wilson High School and earned three degrees from Youngstown University; a Bachelors Degree in Business and a Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Education.

Joe was longtime educator and administrator in the Youngstown City School System and began his career as a teacher in 1964 and retired in 1995 as the principal of West (now William Holmes McGuffey) Elementary School. After his retirement, Joe continued to work for the city schools until 2014 as a utility administrator and substitute principal.

Joe was one of the founding members of St. Joseph Church where he served as a lector and a parish council member and where he was an active leader of the Christ Renews His Parish Program. He was also active in the Mens' Club and was a recipient of the Pope Pius XII Award for his many years teaching religious education at the church.

In addition, he was a longtime member of the Knights of Columbus; first as a member of Father Joseph Gallagher Council 3144 in Youngstown with his father, the late Joe Reda Sr. and then joined our Council 13977 more recently as a 3rd Degree Knight.

Joe enjoyed playing racquetball and bowling in his younger days and was lifelong avid fan of Cleveland pro sports, especially the Cleveland Indians who were close to his heart. He was always remembered as a loving, gentle man with a wonderful sense of humor.

Joe is survived by his beloved wife of 55 years Marilyn J. (Debrosky) Reda, whom he married April 4, 1964; three children, Lisa (Brother Knight Richard) Mattiussi of Austintown, Nancy Reda of Austintown, and Brother Knight Steve (Breanne) Reda of Austintown; three grandchildren, Brother Knight Dominic Mattiussi of Austintown, Monica Mattiussi of Cincinnati, and Brother Knight Nicholas Mattiussi of Austintown; a sister Lois DiFrancesco of Warren; a first cousin, Ellen Bosco of Austintown; several







POPE FRANCIS MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTION-NOVEMBER 2019



Dialogue and Reconciliation in the Near East-That a spirit of dialogue, encounter, and reconciliation emerge in the Near East, where diverse religious communities share their lives together.

From "Rejoice and Be Glad" by Pope Francis:

88. Peacemakers truly "make" peace; they build peace and friendship in society. To those who sow peace Jesus makes this magnificent promise: "They will be called children of God" (Mt 5:9). He told his disciples that, wherever they went, they were to say: "Peace to this house!" (Lk 10:5). The word of God exhorts every believer to work for peace, "along with all who call upon the Lord with a pure heart" (cf. 2 Tm 2:22), for "the harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace" (Jas 3:18). And if there are times in our community when we question what ought to be done, "let us pursue what makes for peace" (Rom 14:19), for unity is preferable to conflict.⁷⁴

MONTHLY CATECHISM PASSAGE-NOVEMBER 2019

813 The Church is one because of her source: "the highest exemplar and source of this mystery is the unity, in the Trinity of Persons, of one God, the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit."259 The Church is one because of her founder: for "the Word made flesh, the prince of peace, reconciled all men to God by the cross, . . . restoring the unity of all in one people and one body."260 The Church is one because of her "soul": "It is the Holy Spirit, dwelling in those who believe and pervading and ruling over the entire Church, who brings about that wonderful communion of the faithful and joins them together so intimately in Christ that he is the principle of the Church's unity."261 Unity is of the essence of the Church:

What an astonishing mystery! There is one Father of the universe, one Logos of the universe, and also one Holy Spirit, everywhere one and the same; there is also one virgin become mother, and I should like to call her "Church."

Council meeting message – November 2019

As Thanksgiving approaches at the end of the month, I like to take stock of all the things I'm thankful for.

It's easy to say family and friends, those are blessings; and we sometimes take them for granted...but how about the little things in life. It might be that smile you get from person who hands you your cup of coffee in the morning, it may be relishing the crisp air on an autumn day. 
